# KJV Q&A Series: Revealing the holes in modern bible versions and why they should not be trusted.

"Every word of God is pure:" ... (KJV Proverbs 30:5a)

"The words of the LORD are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. Thou shalt keep them, O LORD, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever."(KJV Psalms 12:6-7)

Consider this: *Things that are different- <u>are not-</u> the same*. Do you agree?

*Is serving God a Duty... or a Delight?* See what select bible versions say God inspired in Romans 6:22.

**KJV**: But now being made free from sin, and become <u>servants</u> to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life.

**ESV**: But now that you have been set free from sin and have become **slaves** of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life.

**NIV**: But now that you have been set free from sin and have become **slaves** of God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life.

**NASB**: But now having been freed from sin and <u>enslaved</u> to God, you [a]derive your [b] benefit, [c] resulting in sanctification, and the outcome, eternal life.

**RSV**: But now that you have been set free from sin and have become **slaves** of God, the return you get is sanctification and its end, eternal life.

**NKJV**: But now having been set free from sin,and having become **slaves** of God, you have your fruit to holiness and the end, everlasting life.

**NLT**: But now you are free from the power of sin and have become **slaves** of God. Now you do those things that lead to holiness and result in eternal life.

#### According to Webster's 1828 dictionary (but you can look it up at other sources):

<u>Slave</u> means -a person who is wholly subject to the will of another; one who has no will of his own, but whose person and services are wholly under the control of another.

<u>Servant</u> means -a person in the service of another. Servant differs from slave, as the servant's subjection to a master is voluntary, the slave's is not. Every slave is a servant, but every servant is not a slave.

#### Now consider the following passage in light of the "slave or servant" difference.

Galations 4:1-7 (KJV)

"Now I say, That the heir, as long as he is a child, differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all; But is under tutors and governors until the time appointed of the father. Even so we, when we were children, were in bondage under the elements of the world: But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law, To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father. Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ."

## Conclusion to today's post.

God tells us in II Timothy 2:15 (KJV) "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth". (Emphasis mine).

And here in I Corinthians 2:13 (KJV) "Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; **comparing spiritual things with spiritual**." (Emphasis mine).

Man's wisdom comes down to us via 'scholars' and other worldy-wise "guys". God reveals his truth when we compare scripture with scripture.

God tells us in I Corinthians 2:14-16 (KJV) "But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned. But he that is spiritual judgeth all things, yet he himself is judged of no man. For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ." (Emphasis mine).

### Think about it!

We have the mind of Christ- its found in his word! And God cannot lie (Hebrews 6:18 \*see below)- so he must have a perfectly pure version of his words somewhere. When you line up the facts its easy to see where his perfectly preserved word is not. Galations 6:22 is just one out of thousands of changes modern versions contain.

I have more of these kind of comparisons for you and I have incredible historical information about how the <u>KJV</u> came about and the process with which the translators used in finishing the 1611 Authorized Version including their honesty in using italics.

\* Hebews 6:18a "That by two immutable things, in which it was impossible for God to lie,"...
