DIY projects/ crafts, build a clubhouse, bird house – *Check at Lowe's and Home Depot for kid project events*.



Amusement Parks

Family-fun in Ohio doesn't always have to be costly, though usually there's no getting around shelling out some big bucks for the amusement parks. If places like Cedar Point, Geauga Lake, and King's Island are your thing and you want to cut costs I'd recommend packing your own food and drinks. For our family of four (kids being under 9 yrs of age) we have spent around \$20 for lunch inside the park. Here's a post I wrote about our visit to Geauga Lake's Wild Water Kingdom and our visit to Cedar Point in 2012.

Tips for taking young children to amusement parks:

- 1. Plan your day ahead of time. Download/print the park's map and get an idea of what rides are applicable to your family so you don't waste your time waiting in lines unnecessarily.
- 2. Pack your own food for the trip to and from the park or to eat during your visit. Check the park rules first.
- 3. Bring dry clothes! Especially for the little ones. A long ride home at night in wet clothes is not very fun.
- 4. Pack sunscreen, hats, and sunglasses as well as LOTS of bottled water!
- 5. If you're using the a/c in the car bring some blankets along to keep your sleepy angels cozy on the ride home. See my post below for more...

Over the years I have gone both ways: some years I've just bought a single science museum membership and other years I've bought a combined membership. Currently we are members through the McKinley Museum in Canton.


